





"I could, as a free man, look across the bay toward the Eastern Shore where I was born a slave."




"I was born in Tuckahoe, near Hillsborough, and about twelve miles from Easton, in Talbot County, Maryland."

"From that moment, I understood the pathway from slavery to freedom."




"Once you learn to read, you will forever be free."

O that I were free!"


